



California Nursing Practice Act

Excerpt from Section 2725. Legislative Intent. Practice of Nursing Defined

2725 (a) – Nursing is a dynamic field.

Clear legal authority for functions and procedures.

Recognizes the overlapping functions between physicians and registered nurses

2725 (b) practice of nursing include basic health care...that require substantial amount of scientific knowledge or technical skills, including all of the following:

1. Direct and indirect care that ensure safety comfort, personal hygiene, and protection of patients; and the performance of disease prevention and restorative measures.
2. Direct and indirect patient care services, including, but not limited to, the administration of medications and therapeutic agents, necessary to implement a treatment, disease prevention, or rehabilitative regimen ordered by and within the scope of licensure of a physician



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3. The performance of skin tests, immunization techniques, and the withdrawal of human blood from veins and arteries.
4. Observation of signs and symptoms of illness, reactions to treatment, general behavior, or general physical condition, and **(A)** determination of whether the signs, symptoms, reactions, behavior, or general appearance exhibit abnormal characteristics, and **(B)** implementation, based on observed abnormalities, of appropriate reporting, or referral, or standardized procedures, or changes in treatment regimen in accordance with standardized procedures, or the initiation of emergency procedures
(c) Standardized Procedures...
